# Highlights of Greater Moncton CommunityReport Card



## Satisfaction with Municipal Governments:

- 87 % rated municipal governments Good or Excellent
- Quite a few smiles among municipal councillors in the room when that data was shared



### Rating Municipal Services:

- Water Services, Green Spaces, Recreational Facilities, Garbage Collection, Police Services all rated 88 per cent or higher with Good or Excellent ratings.
- Public Transit Affordability, Snow Clearing and Bus Stop Locations were the next set, with positive ratings between 79 to 80 per cent.
- Then came bus wait times (62%), bus schedules (58%) and road maintenance (52%) as least favourable.





### Support for Amalgamation:

- 40% strongly or somewhat support
- 22% neither support nor oppose
- 33% oppose or strongly oppose
- Support highest in Moncton and lowest in Riverview





### Plebiscite on Amalgamation:

- 48% say they support a plebiscite
- 22% neither support nor oppose
- Only 19% oppose a plebiscite
- So the story seems to be "We don't necessarily want amalgamation, but please ask us the question."





### Support for Joint Infrastructure Projects:

- 68% support or strongly support
- Only 9% oppose
- Already a great deal happening in this area among the three municipalities





### Quality of Life:

 Very high scores for 'good place to raise a family', commute times, good place to grow old, recreational facilities, easy to get around





### Perceptions of the Economy:

- 62% rated economy 'good' or 'excellent'
- 30% rated economy 'fair'
- Only 3% rated it 'poor'



## Expectations of the Economy Next Year:

- 87% expected economy to be the same or better (and the 'same' is pretty good right now)
- Only 4% thought it would be worse





## Start a Business or Grow an Existing Business:

- Between 48 and 53% rate it as 'Good' or 'Excellent'
- Only 8% think we are a 'Poor' place to start a business; 5% think we are 'Poor' to grow an existing business





#### Cost of Food and Groceries:

- Are they affordable? 58% say 'Yes'
- One-in-four say they have made a choice between food and other life necessities
- These are wake-up calls on affordability in our region





### Poverty:

- Compared to 10 years ago, 37% says it is a much or slightly bigger problem than 10 years ago
- Another wake-up call. All segments of our community need to enjoy some degree of economic success



#### Carbon Tax:

- Only 40% support the federal government's tax on carbon
- Highest among 18-34
- Only half of respondents said they would pay any extra on the price of gas to combat climate change





#### Downtown Vibrancy:

- 71% completely or partially agree their downtown is vibrant
- 67% believe it is a better place than it was a year ago
- Expect these numbers to climb as investments continue





### Concerns around parking at Downtown Centre:

- 74% concerned
- 45% said they would be willing to take public transit to an event (an opportunity)
- We don't expect to see this number remain high a year from now





### Safety:

• 84% of people feel mostly or very safe in their neighbourhoods.





### Immigration:

- 55% support or strongly support increasing immigration
- 23% neither support nor oppose
- Only 19% oppose increased immigration.
  (Compared to provincial survey a year ago showing 68% of respondents think we have enough or too much immigration)
